Objective of the Webinars in Transatlantic Project:

Blue economy seeks to promote economic growth, social inclusion, and the monitoring and improvement of the environmental and circular sustainability of the oceans and coastal areas. In other words, <u>blue economy is a matter of people</u>, data, research, entrepreneurship and resources.

And especially, <u>resources</u> are one of the ingredients that are always lacking in order to bring the innovation in the blue economy to a higher level. Working at sea is very expensive and coastal areas are mostly difficult to reach. Excellent researchers and persistent entrepreneurs are working on both sides of the ocean to develop this blue economy. Next to the presence of resources, it is obvious that transatlantic cooperation is a major tool to give the blue economy within the Atlantic Ocean wind in its sails.

That is why <u>Webinar 3 of the Transatlantic project</u> will investigate some of the funding opportunities that actually exist to support the work of researchers and entrepreneurs and their cooperation. Moreover, the webinar aims to valorise the results of the first mission to the province of Québec(October 2024) and to feed the contents of the <u>next mission to the region of Wales (May 2025)</u>. In a larger context, it will help to identify the potential to develop a more structured cooperation within the Atlantic Area, involving and attracting non-EU stakeholders

The general objective of the TRANSATLANTIC pilot project is to support the maritime recovery within the Atlantic Ocean by creating a cooperation platform at transatlantic level to foster exchanges of best practices and joint projects in the field of the sustainable blue economy. This kind of cooperations is of major importance to the Atlantic coastal regions, including outermost regions and non-EU regions at both sides at the Ocean. The Transatlantic project has been launched by CEIMAR (ES), Forum Oceano (PT) and CPMR Atlantic Arch, in close cooperation with the Region of Wales and the Province of Québec. It is an initiative funded by the European Parliament of an experimental nature and supported by DG REGIO, European Commission.

Major attention hereby goes to: green corridors and the decarbonization of ports, the development of sustainable aquaculture and marine renewable energy. Within each of these sectors, the role of artificial intelligence is of major importance.
